His career in the CANDU nuclear industry includes development, engineering, licensing and project management with senior management positions at Atomic Energy of Canada, Ontario Power Generation and CANDU Owners' Group (COG). He held engineering management roles for Bruce, Pickering and CANDU 6 plants, as well as overall engineering responsibility for returning Darlington and Bruce plants to high power operation. He has worked on development of CANDU reactor concepts and continues to be an avid proponent for the future of nuclear power. In addition to his continuing interest in the advancement of nuclear power, Frank has served as a member of the board of directors for several non profit organizations.

In his presentation, Mr. Doyle will discuss his perspective on the roles of the CNS, COG and Chalk River Laboratories, and how they are aligning their strategic directions to better support the future of nuclear in Canada.
