2006 Annual General Meeting followed by a presentation on The Global Nuclear Energy Partnership (GNEP) What is it, and what role might Canada play in it?

The Chalk River Branch of the Canadian Nuclear Society will hold its Annual General Meeting for 2006 on Thursday, October 26, 2006 at 7:00 pm in the Bennett/Mackenzie Room of the J.L. Gray Centre in Deep River. Following the meeting, Dr. Gary Dyck of AECL, Chalk River Laboratories, will speak about the Global Nuclear Energy Partnership (GNEP), and new initiative being lead by the United States.

The United States' Global Nuclear Energy Partnership (GNEP) has been in the news quite often, of late. It represents a major re-thinking of U.S. policy towards the nuclear fuel cycle and the global nuclear market place. Canada, as a nation that designs and sells nuclear reactors, could be profoundly affected by these potential changes.

This presentation will describe the Global Nuclear Energy Partnership and some of the challenges and opportunities it may present to the Canadian nuclear industry, and the CANDU nuclear reactor, in particular.

Gary Dyck earned a Ph.D. in nuclear physics from the University of Manitoba. He has over sixteen years of experience in reactor physics with AECL, where he currently has responsibility for advanced fuels and fuel cycles.
